Dear Mr. Ferriero:

Under your leadership, the National Archives made nearly 170,000 pages of records available to the public related to Justice Elena Kagan's time serving under President Clinton. This information allowed the U.S. Senate and the American people to fully vet her nomination to our nation's highest court. We now respectfully ask you to do the same for Judge Brett Kavanaugh.

Judge Kavanaugh has spent several years working for the federal government, first in the U.S. Department of Justice's Office of Special Counsel under Kenneth Starr and later as Associate Counsel, White House Staff Secretary and Assistant to President George W. Bush. The American people deserve open and transparent information about Judge Kavanaugh's work on the *Starr Report*, the Bush's administration's detention and interrogation policies, and any other matters he worked on during his time in government.

I urge you to work with the White House and the George W. Bush Presidential Library to make public all documents related to Judge Kavanaugh's federal service. I understand that expediting the release of these files will be a significant undertaking, but it is essential that the Senate and the American public can give full consideration to Judge Kavanaugh's qualifications, character, and legal perspective.

I thank you for your consideration in this matter, and I look forward to your work on this issue.
