MODIFICATION OF AUTHORITY TO USE ARMED 2 FORCES TO ENFORCE FEDERAL AUTHORITY. 3 Section 252 of title 10, United States Code, is 4 amended-5 (1) by inserting "(a) IN GENERAL.—" before 6 "Whenever"; and 7 (2) by adding at the end the following new sub-8 section: 9 "(b) PEACEFUL Protests AND DEMONSTRA-TIONS.—Notwithstanding subsection (a), the President 10 may not deploy a member of a regular component of the 11 armed forces serving on active duty within a State or terri-12 13 tory of the United States to respond to a peaceful protest or demonstration except upon the request of the governor 14 or chief executive of the State or territory.". 15 SEC. 3.
